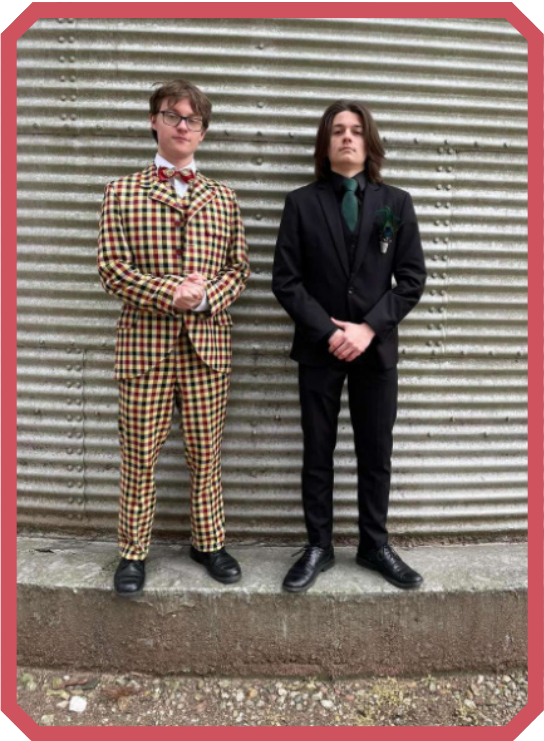

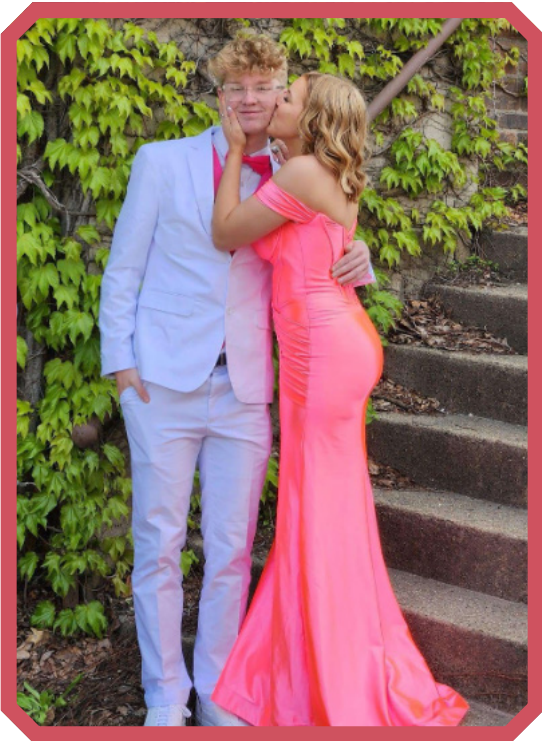

Senior Celine L. left a response,

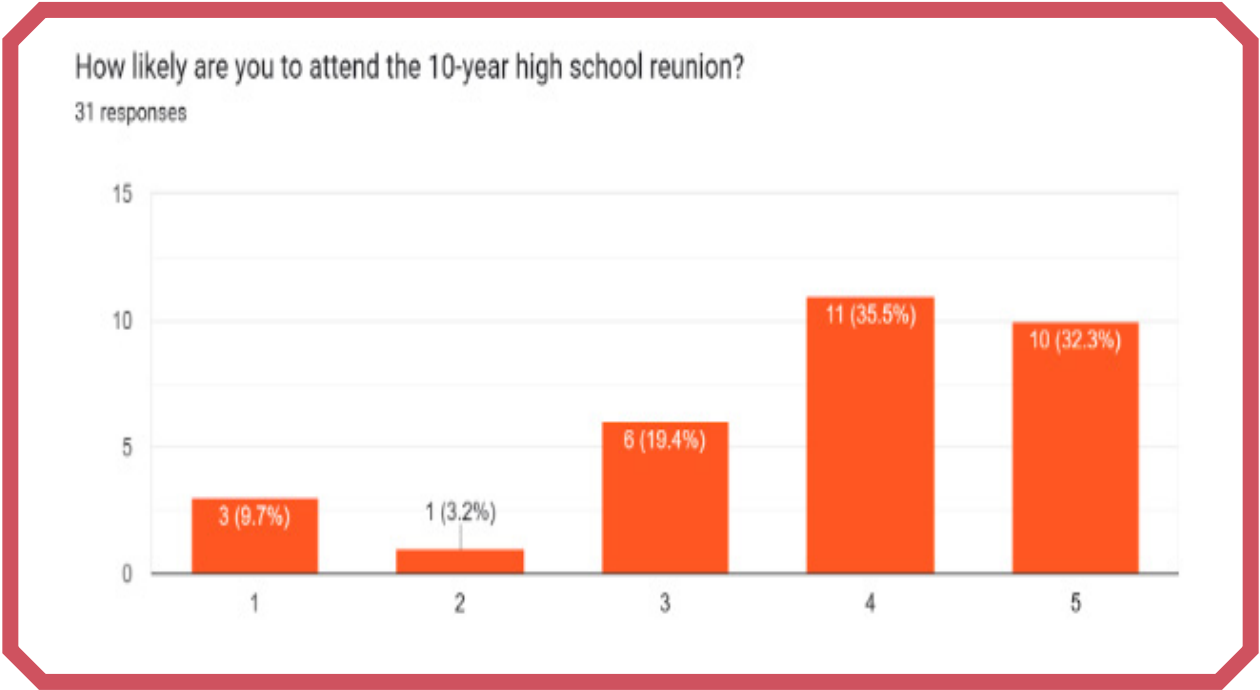


