
Inside Out 2 - Grace H.

I loved the original 'Inside Out,' so I'm looking forward to the new sequel. The three new characters would be fun to see because of how they will change the plot.




'Dead Pool and Wolverine' - Lexi R.

Mrs. Edmonds, a long-time educator here, is the first of our retiring staff this year, and we would like to recognize her involvement, dedication and care for her students.

For starters, Edmonds has been teaching students here since 1995; that's a whole 29 years of service to our district! Over the course of those 29 years, she has offered an incredible number of classes, such as Algebra 1, Algebra 2, Geometry, Precalculus, Calculus, Statistics, Trigonometry, Math 1, Math 2, Math 3, Math 4 and ICC Math 110.

Apart from her main courses, Edmonds has also been involved in extracurricular programs. In the past, she was the coach/sponsor for the student council for 15 full years, and on top of that, she directed the drama department for a whole 5 years.
