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Illini Bluffs begins to implement AI in classroom

After assembling a task force and conducting a year of research, Illini Bluffs has decided to implement new artificial intelligence tools in all three schools. The AI they have chosen is called Magic School, a platform engineered to help out both students and teachers in the classroom. It was implemented over break after much deliberation about choices regarding which EdTech company the school wanted to go with.

“It’s one of the top-rated, if not the top-rated, in safety,” Superintendent Dimitri Almasi said. “It also syncs with Google Classroom; there’s 80 different kinds of tools you can use as a teacher and student, so it’s not just like a Chat GPT put in a prompt.”

With those tools, you can do anything from writing an educational parody song, to drafting an IEP for a student based on their specific needs.

“I use it to brainstorm ideas for IEP goals and accommodations.” Elementary Special Education Teacher and AI Task Force member, Ms. Carly Scott, said. “I also use it to help me differentiate any materials for different grade levels.”

It’s also good for creating problems, rubrics and helping teachers structure their class. The tool replaces searching the internet and books for good problems to fill the rubric.

“There are tools that allow me to create



a detailed rubric for each standard, create a variety of math problems per standard and to create multiple assessment ideas for each standard,” eighth-grade math teacher, Mr. Martin, said.

But, like most generative tools, there are some worries. Magic School AI does pull from the entire internet, so, while some of it is credible, other parts can be from hateful message boards. It’s never entirely safe due to the vast amount of content on the internet, which has left some teachers hesitant to begin implementation.

“Before we share it with teachers or students, we need to ensure that they have the skills to properly evaluate the information that comes from that platform,” high school

Librarian and AI Task Force member, Mrs. Coulter, said.

Learning media literacy is the most important task when it comes to learning how to properly use AI tools. Differentiating and choosing what goes in and out of what goes to your students or your teacher is crucial when using generative AI.

As long as students and teachers both are given the proper tools to learn media, news and AI literacy, this tool will assist everybody in the classroom.

“If you’re all off to college, these tools are out there,” Superintendent Almasi said. “I want to make sure that there’s some guidance on how to use these, and make sure that you’re doing it in an appropriate way.”

Illinois changes test: Juniors to take ACT, not SAT, in Spring

The state of Illinois switched from the SAT to the ACT this year, but what’s the difference, and how does it impact you?

The ACT has four tests — math, reading, English, science and writing — which are then averaged to give a final score. The most prominent difference between the ACT and the SAT is that the ACT has a science portion, while the SAT does not. For the ACT, you will test for a total of 215 minutes. Though this may seem daunting, there are a multitude of resources available for you to utilize to prepare for the ACT.

“Once the state uploads all of the kids’ names and I can print the tickets, then we can even go in and take individualized practice tests based on who they are and their scores,” high school guidance counselor, Ms. Marvin, said.

Not only will students be able to take personalized practice tests, but teachers will be given ACT practice books to start preparing the students for the ACT with a more centralized focus.

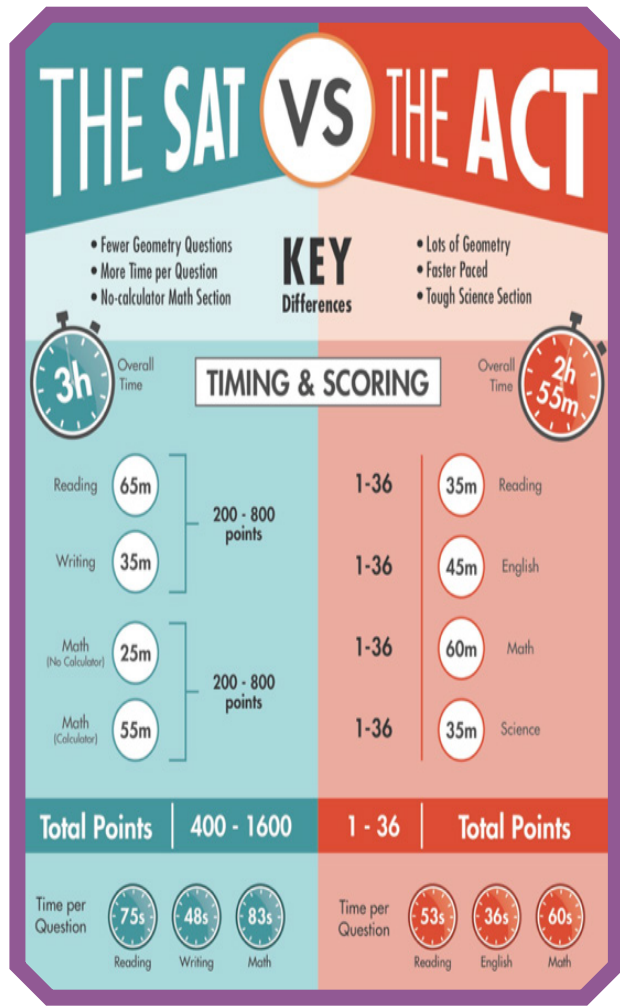
The ACT is based off of the standard high school curriculum in Illinois, so what you’ve

learned thus far in math, English, reading and science will be what you are tested over. The SAT is the same as the ACT in the curriculum-based math portion, but the rest of the sections are global overview-based. This means that the SAT is asking, “Can you assimilate these three facts and come up with the right answer?”

Both the ACT and the SAT are required; however, both tests can be retaken as many times as you want, but you will have to pay for the retakes yourself. If you wish to retake your ACT, then Ms. Marvin can provide you with the test, but you must take it at either Bradley or ICC. Also, in applications, you can submit your “super-score,” which is the average of your best section scores from different test dates.

Your ACT score, which is the average of all five of your scores, will determine if you’re college-ready. An average score of 17-24 suggests that you are performing at the expected level, with a 36 being a perfect score. However, for a four-year college, readiness is more of a mid-to upper-twenties range. A high score can only help you, so try your hardest.

Juniors at Illini Bluffs will take the ACT on April 19, 2025. The test will last 215 minutes, not including breaks.



Tiktok Ban

While you may not personally have TikTok downloaded on your phone, someone you know was definitely going through it on Jan. 19, 2025, when TikTok decided to shut down its servers in the U.S.

TikTok, while not needing to shut down its servers and only needing to be removed from the app store, went dark for a lot of its American users due to a nationwide ban of the app over accusations of data collection.

While the servers were only down for roughly 14 hours, users were in an uproar throughout the entire duration of it on various different social media sites. Threats of a TikTok ban have always been present, but it truly did stop everyone in their tracks once they realized it wasn't just a misplaced threat.

Back in 2020, during his first term, President Donald Trump wanted the app banned or sold to an American company, simply because he deemed it a threat to national security. The company that owns TikTok, ByteDance, originally was very reluctant to sell the app. It was believed that the company using TikTok was stealing data from its American users due to the parent company being based in China.

The app was only truly considered for being banned in 2024 due to the pre-existing security concerns, and the fact the app had heavy bias towards the people of Palestine. Pro-Palestinian bias was definitely a huge driving factor in the app being put on the chopping block, especially considering a lot of companies and corporations rarely speak up for the people in Gaza. Lots of TikTok users utilized the app to advocate and show their support for the country of Palestine, which resulted in the push to censor and ban imagery coming from journalists who were trying to document everything that they could.

The TikTok ban was essentially a form of censorship, a way for the American people to be shut off from the rest of the world. TikTok is, for lack of a better term, a highway for news and information to be shared globally due to its popularity. People use it as their main source of news for this very reason. When you take these kinds of tools away, you are actively censoring what people are seeing. This has been a common theme in history, most notably with the banning of books, and there's a high chance that there will be even more censorship happening in the near future.

While there was an extension to the time TikTok has to change owners, users are still wary on what the future holds for their beloved app.

Name brands

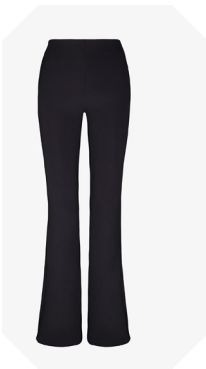

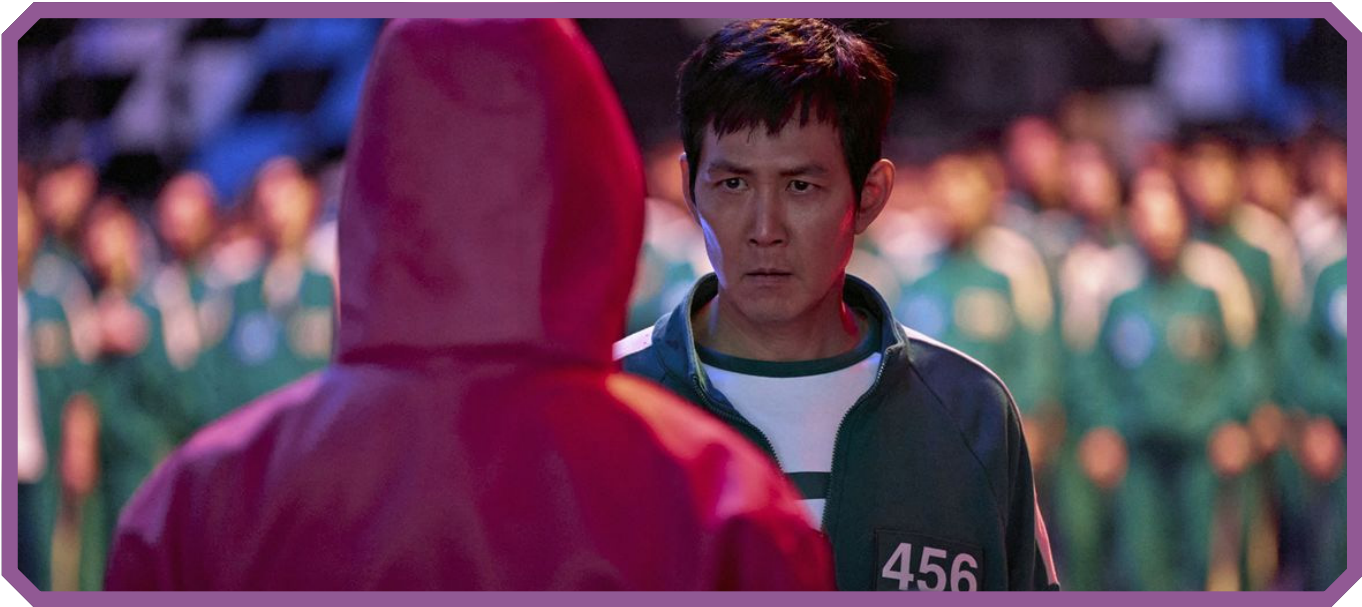
'Squid Game' season 2 review

One thing this season does a lot better than the previous one is introducing a really interesting cast of characters. Compared to season one, I’ve found that these characters have been a lot more enjoyable and memorable. I’d definitely say that Thanos, a rapper who went into debt due to investing in a failed cryptocurrency, was one of the most memorable for me. His energy and overall attitude throughout the season was so fun and I was definitely laughing every single time he showed up on screen. Along with those characters that pulled at my heartstrings, we had a lot more representation this season in terms of queer representation. Player 120, also known as Cho Hyun-ju, is a trans woman who entered the games in hopes of winning enough money to support her transition. Her character overall was a huge breath of fresh air to see in mainstream media, especially because her identity as a trans woman was simply just a fact and wasn’t the entire point of her character. She proved herself over and over again to be a very valuable asset to the ragtag group we start to see develop itself halfway through the season. All of her scenes were very thoughtful and I could definitely see her being a



good example of the trans community, just simply for the fact she was very sure of her identity and how she presented herself to the other players. Some of the players reacted very negatively toward her, but those who got to actually know player 120 just accepted the fact she was a trans woman and would be as respectful as they could to her identity.

No matter how lovable these characters are, there are still some glaringly large issues overall with the season itself. In terms of plot, this season definitely falls short compared to its predecessor. The first season took itself a lot more seriously, which meant we got a lot more about the characters and their lives. The story itself didn’t feel that dragged out, either. It was that perfect blend of rushing in the high adrenaline parts and taking it agonizingly slow in parts that required time and care. Season 2, in comparison, would be agonizingly slow in parts that really were just not that interesting. They focused on certain characters, which weren’t even in the games nor were they introduced in the first season, that didn’t really need that extra screen time. It also felt, overall, very rushed.

The first season did this really well, in my opinion, and was able to successfully get the viewer from start to end of the season without them feeling as though they had been rushed through an overly complicated plot.

I believe that if they fix the pacing issue and continue to maintain the character dynamics and personalities of the second season, Squid Games season 3 could potentially be the highlight season of the show.

“Both of our supersectional appearances have motivated us,” Devon said. “We had two close losses which makes us want the win even more.”

With Devon and Toby’s senior year season coming to an end, both guys have plans for their futures.

“No plans for basketball,” Toby said. “It’s over for me after senior year.”

While Toby’s basketball career is ending Devon’s isn’t.

“I don’t know where yet,” Devon said. “I’m still doing recruitment stuff. That’s the goal to play after high school.”

In the meantime, both boys are looking forward to a long postseason run, one filled with plenty of opportunities. One head coach Trey David views as highly “rewarding.”

“As a coach, I couldn’t ask for more than to witness our seniors grow, not only as athletes, but also as young men throughout our time together,” David said.

“From sitting back to back school win records and eclipsing 1,000 career points to back to back elite eight appearances and becoming team captains this year, their accomplishments speak for themselves.”

Regardless of the outcome of the season, David is especially proud of these two athletes, whom he has coached since they were “energetic third graders.”

“We’ve experienced many highs and lows together, but through it all, Toby and Devon have remained composed and humble.”

Toby - Buffalo Bills

The Buffalo Bills are set to face the Kansas City Chiefs in the AFC Championship Game on Sunday, January 26, 2025, at 6:30 PM ET at Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City, Missouri. 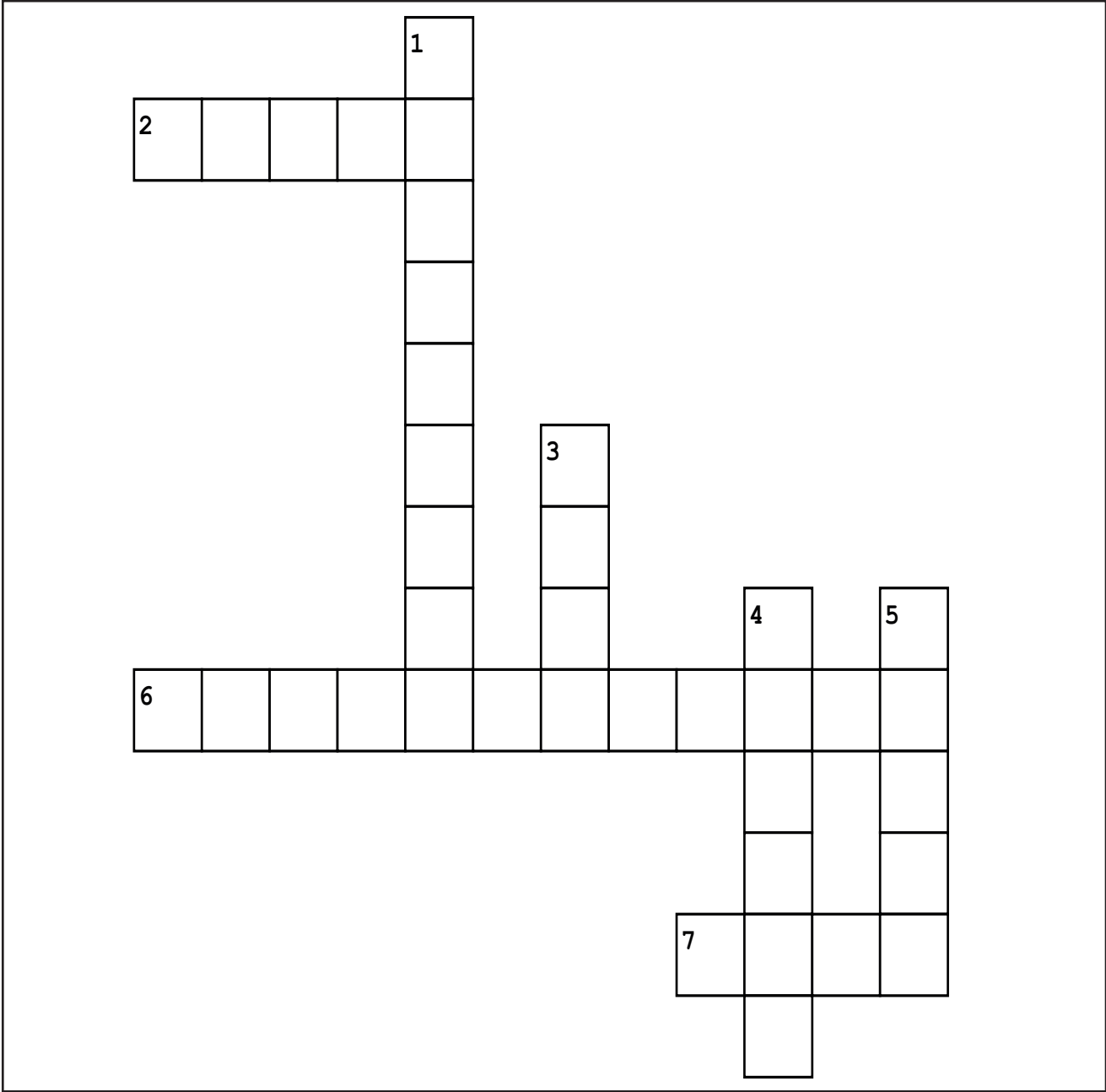
