Illini Bluffs High School online safety presentation

Students at Illini Bluffs High School recently took part in listening to a presentation—thanks to the Illinois Attorney General's Office—about online safety and how to stay safe in the rapidly evolving digital world.

Karilyn Orr, the representative who came to present on Sept. 23, spoke with students about the risks of having an online presence, and how to mitigate the danger. Orr talked to the students about how many of the cases they see are related to grooming, different types of manipulation and "sextortion," when a person threatens to share explicit content online unless their demands are met.

She works in the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, which is a team that

works to prevent crimes against minors online. She explains how a lot of victims are too scared to speak up because they don't want to get in trouble.

"One mistake I see teens make is not trusting that it's okay to tell a parent or law enforcement," Orr said. "Reporting isn't snitching, it's protecting yourself or a friend."

Many students felt that they walked away from the presentation with new tools to help protect themselves and others.

"The websites were pretty cool," junior Serina S. said. "I had no idea about them, the one called 'Take It Down' stood out. If you've sent a photo you're scared might get shared, you can send it in and they'll work to remove it from platforms."

The final Conjuring movie came out on Friday, Sept. 5. The film is a part of a series that has sequels, so it's a good time to talk about all the movies in the franchise and how they all differ from one another. Based on all these films, we've decided to rank them by jump scare factor, horror factor, and overall ranking of the movies.

Jump Scare Factor

All of "The Conjuring" movies have a variety of jump scares in them, but how scary they are varies greatly. This can make a lot of people jump, but not like the scares in the other movies could.

The third was ranked as an 8/10 because the scares wouldn't make it to a 10 out of 10, but they were better than the first two movies. In this conjuring, one of the jump scares was when David, Judy's son, heard a big banging while lying in bed, which caused him to run into the bathroom. He had jumped into the bath tub and closed the shower curtain, and when the movie cuts to the top of the curtain you can see a pair of hands that disappear and the shower nozzles turn on and blood starts shooting out of the shower. When Ed broke open the door, David was in the corner and came running out with a sharp piece of glass, shoving it into Ed's leg. This scene caused us to jump out of our seats or even close our eyes.

The fourth was ranked an overall 10 out of 10 because the characters that did the jump scares looked the scariest out of all the movies, a very important factor, and the scares were overall just the best. For example, the little girl Shannon Smurk in the fourth conjuring had a doll that crawled on the floor. Demon Slayer kills at the box office

“Demon Slayer: Kimetsu no Yaiba–Infinity Castle” has been a long-awaited movie to the point that it gained more money on its opening weekend than the cost of the movie itself, The movie is 2 hours and 35 minutes long, The budget of the movie itself is \$20 million but on it’s opening weekend it earned over \$17.3 million Friday–Sunday bringing Its total domestic gross to \$104.73 million in the U.S. and a total of over \$555 million worldwide, It now holds the title of the highest-grossing anime film of all time and the highest-grossing Japanese film globally.

The primary factor contributing to the movie's success is the fighting scenes; there are a total of six fighting scenes ranked from weakest to strongest. Fight one. Shinobu Kocho VS. Doma. In this fight, Shinobu is after revenge against Doma for what he did. Fight two. Zenitsu Agatsuma VS. Kaigaku. In this fight, Kaigaku was a former Senior of Zenitsu, whom he no longer sees as his Senior because of the decisions Kaigaku had made. Fight three. Tanjiro Kamado and Giyu Tomioka VS. Akaza. In this fight, when Tanjiro sees Akaza, he seeks to avenge Kyojuri Rengoku. Fight four. Kanao Truyuri and Inosuke Hashibira VS. Doma. In this fight, Inosuke finds out what Doma did, and is enraged. Fight five. Mitsuri Kanroji and Obanai Iguro VS. Nakime. There is not much I can put down about this fight without spoiling it. Fight six. Muichiro Tokito, Genya Shinazugawa, Senemi Shinazugawa, and Gyomei Himejima VS. Kokushibo. In this fight, they band together to fight the rank one Kokushibo, which is the highest rank below Muzan. The final fight is all demon slayers against the demon king Muzan.

Some people who haven't watched Demon Slayer are probably asking why there is so much hype about the seasons and the movie itself. Well, the first season came out on April 6 to Sept. 28, 2019. The first season has been viewed 2.1 billion times in total. This 26-episode season was produced by Studio Ufotable and adapted from the early chapters of the manga series. Although the manga series came out in 2016, it is still high-ranked, even though it is the youngest by 20 years compared to the other most popular manga on the all-time list. The second season began airing in Japan on Oct. 10, 2021, with the Mugen Train Arc Recompilation, and the main Entertainment District Arc started on Dec. 5, 2021, ending on Feb. 13, 2022. The third season, titled the Swordsmith Village Arc, premiered on April 9, 2023. It concluded on June 18, 2023, with an extended 70-minute episode, the fourth season, titled the "Hashira Training Arc", premiered on May 12, 2024, the season concluded with a 1-hour episode on June 30, 2024, which leads us to the first part of the Demon Slayer Infinity Castle movie, it was first released in Japan on July 18, 2025, but it didn't release in the U.S. until September of 2025. For the 2nd and final part of the movie, there is no official release date, but there is wide speculation that the second part of the movie will come out in 2027 and the final part in 2029.

Because of the intense fighting scenes and the high-tier animations, Demon Slayer is one of the best fighting anime of all time, as well as the stories and flashbacks of each character, which is what makes the anime so unique.

‘IEWU’ court case could be seeing a new face: Taylor Swift

Blake Lively and Justin Baldoni are appearing, once again, on national television. They are scheduled for federal court against each other located in New York on March 9, 2026. The trial is regarding each other’s feud of allegations that were exchanged between the two actors while filming, “It Ends With Us.” However, this time there is one new potential addition to the case: Taylor Swift.

There are many possible reasons why Taylor Swift is being dragged into this legal battle due to a few factors. These theories could include the feature of her song “My Tears Ricochet” from the writer’s album “Folklore” being in the film, or her friendship, at the time, with Blake Lively during this production.

Taylor Swift was not listed as a defendant, but her name has popped up in legal documents. For instance, the judge informed Baldoni that the messages between the girls must be turned over to him.

While no individual wants to participate in legal action, the singer is going to do everything she can to prevent being involved.

“My client did not agree to a deposition, but if she is forced into a deposition, we advised that her schedule would accommodate the time required during the week of Oct. 20 if the parties were able to work out their disputes,” Swift’s lawyer, Douglas Baldrige said.

If Taylor is forced into the case, she will be expected to present information on the conversations and any additional news that was shared with her by Blake. However, in the long run, if she is dragged into the legal battle it could impact her reputation and career. Taylor Swift had cut ties between her and Lively due to her feeling betrayed and the legal action against Justin Baldoni; news reports informed readers that Blake didn’t even reach out regarding Swift’s recent engagement to Travis Kelce. The celebrities had been friends since 2015, starting with the songwriter’s song, “Bad Blood.” To add to this, Taylor is also the godmother to Blake and Ryan’s children. However, right now, Blake Lively is a person that not many people want to be seen with.

The scripted match that became a violent assault

Raja Jackson, son of UFC fighter Rampage Jackson, assaulted wrestler Syko Stu on a livestream during a scripted wrestling event due to a work gone wrong.

Raja Jackson started his live stream on a streaming platform known as KICK, where he was set to tour the backstage area of a big wrestling promotion called Knokx Pro Entertainment, where he would talk to the wrestlers behind the scenes and go over the day in the life of a scripted performer, but while he was doing this, a wrestler at this promotion named Syko Stu who had mistaken Raja Jackson for another wrestler started doing a work with him which involved hitting a prop beer can over his head which initially made Raja Jackson really upset. But after finding out he wasn't actually a wrestler, Syko Stu apologized to him, clearing up any miscommunication between the two. Later, Raja Jackson is informed by some of the executives of the promotion that he can interrupt Syko Stu's match to get his "payback" for his earlier stunt with the beer can.

And during his walk-out to the crowd while waiting for his time to interrupt the match, all the other wrestlers are telling him to sell it and make it look real to make it seem like he was actually upset from earlier, but what they didn't know was that he actually was still really mad about the work earlier while waiting in the crowd he talked to his live-stream saying stuff like "I'm gonna really have to show him that you can't just hit a can on my face... I'm really going to hit him, I'm telling you. I'm dead serious, this is not going to be scripted, I'm telling you". Raja Jackson said, leading many minutes later to Raja interrupting Syko Stu's match by slamming him on his head, which initially knocked him out, and straight after laying 20 punches to a helpless man one after another, until another wrestler in the promotion pulled him off, leading to Raja being kicked out of the promotion and the live stream ending all while Syko Stu was laying bleeding in the middle of the ring and eventually taken to the hospital where he would lie in a coma for five days.

This situation has caused an uproar online, and many are calling for Raja to be banned from any type of Sports Entertainment for the rest of his life if he's not arrested for the attack, and at the very least, be required to take anger management classes to ensure an outburst like this never occurs again. Syko Stu has not pressed charges at the time of this article, and seemingly doesn't intend to, but the state has pressed forward, deeming it a state crime under California law. As a result, Raja is still being pursued for criminal charges, and a felony warrant for his arrest has been issued. And on Sept. 18th, Raja Jackson was arrested and charged with felony assault, where he is being held in county jail on a \$50,000 bail awaiting a trial.

Paige Bueckers was just named the 2025 WNBA rookie of the year. Paige is a 23-year-old basketball player who rose to fame during her high school days at Hopkins High School in Hopkins, Minnesota. She later committed to UConn in 2020 where she won numerous awards and broke many records. She played for five years at UConn, and through her collegiate career, she faced many challenges and injuries, but through it all, she leaned on her faith and ended up winning the 2025 National Championship in April. Just a week later, she was picked as number one overall in the WNBA draft and went to the Dallas Wings. Let's take a look back at her record-breaking season as a rookie and all she has accomplished this past year.

On May 16, 2025, Bueckers officially made her long-awaited debut as a rookie, where she scored 10 points, seven rebounds and two assists. Paige then went on to score her first 20 point game of her career on May 27 against the Connecticut Sun. May may have been quiet for her, but she was just starting to heat up. In June, Bueckers was named one of the starters in the 2025 WNBA All Star team, becoming the first rookie to start in a WNBA All Star game. She also went on to score 35 points on June 11 against the Phoenix Mercury. July began, and with no surprise, Paige continued to add to her already great rookie season. Bueckers was selected as a starter for the 2025 WNBA all star game, which took place on July 19. She played on team Collier and became the first player to start in an all star game their rookie year. During All Star weekend, Paige also revealed she is dating long time best friend and previous UConn teammate, who she met through USA basketball at 15, Azzi Fudd. August came and records were broken, again, but one record specifically stands out. On Aug. 20, Paige broke the record for the most points scored by a rookie in a single game with 44 points. And not only that, it was efficient, making her the first player in WNBA history to score 40 or more points on 80% shooting from the field.

The Dallas Wings ended their season with a record of 10 wins and 34 losses. Paige started in all 36 games she played in and ended with averaging 19.2 points, 5.4 assists and 3.9 rebounds. Paige broke countless records which include Most All star fan votes received by a rookie, fastest player in WNBA history to reach both 500 points and 100 assists, first rookie to average 15+ points, five+ assists and 45%+ shooting for an entire season. She also had the fourth longest streak of scoring double digit points, in league history of 30 games, she only had one game where she scored single digit points the entire season. Although the Dallas wings may not have had the best season Paige certainly did.




Supporting the local hockey team
