## Only athletes to get phone priviledges at IB

Superintendent Dr. Dimitri Almasi and High School Principal Mr. Martin have announced a new policy allowing cell phone use exclusively for high school student-athletes. Earlier this school year, phones were restricted to lunch periods only; however, under this new decision, athletes will receive expanded access throughout the school day.

According to administration, the change was made because many coaches do not have immediate access to their athletes throughout the school day, making communication about

practices and workouts more difficult. This also affects students, who are often unable to reach their coaches due to obligations, such as attending TAP to complete assignments, unexpected doctor's appointments and other scheduling conflicts.

"The student-athletes here at Illini Bluffs have very demanding schedules, and this new policy keeps them connected and prepared," Almasi said. "This will allow for success both on and off the field."

There are many reasons why these students are receiving this opportunity, especially as the school



approaches the softball season. These athletes put in significant effort both in and out of the classroom, with some arguing they have earned these "special privileges."

"We are the hardest-working athletes, and our sport goes to state more often compared to others," Sara F. said.

For those who do not know, Sara is a prime

example of student success. The softball player will be attending Creighton University as a Division I athlete. However, some students do not see the policy the same way and believe it should apply to all students involved in extracurricular activities, not just athletes.

"This is unfair because I am involved in many extracurriculars that are not

sports but take up just as much time and effort, and we need communication as well," Carson B. said. "I also put in just as much effort, if not more, which has placed me in the top ten."

As a result, members of Drama Club and Scholastic Bowl plan to bring their concerns about the policy to the next school board meeting which will be held on Apr. 20.

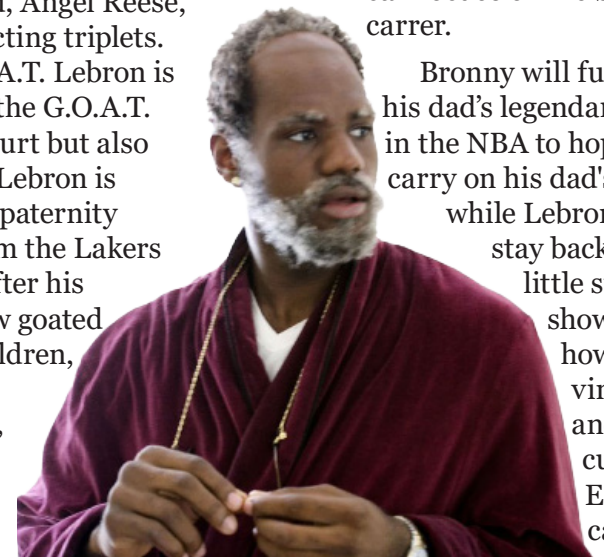

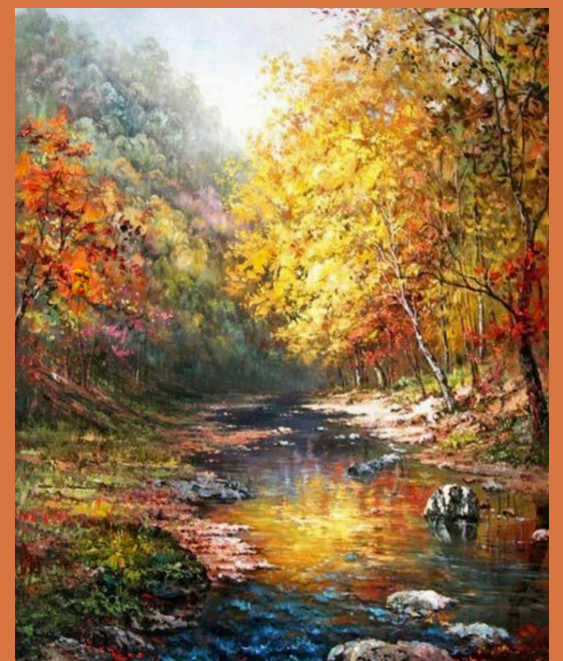
